

# THANK YOU GEORGIA PARENT MENTOR PARTNERSHIP (GaPMP) FOR AN ANOTHER EXCELLENT YEAR LEADING FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

The Divisions for Special Education will be requesting approval from the State Board of Education at its June meeting for allocations for our current 79 GaPMP systems and to add additional IDEA funding for parent mentor positions in Social Circle, Hart and Haralson school systems and our three state schools. In addition, we are pleased to announce that Stephens County will be returning this fall. We also salute Thomaston-Upson, Columbia and Effingham school systems for believing in the initiative so much to fully fund a parent mentor position in 2009-2010. All three systems are expected to receive IDEA funds toward their parent mentor positions this fall. Also, kudos to Fulton County who used its own funding in 2009 to hire a third parent mentor, Zoila Martinez, who is bilingual and is targeting her work with Latino families.

DID YOU KNOW? Parent Mentors will be using their school systems' results on the FY10 Parent Surveys and/or IEP annual attendance rates as one of their *quantitative* annual data measures. Annually, each mentor prepares an anecdotal data story to show his/her family engagement work toward improving a targeted IDEA indicator. This year, mentors also will tie in their district's results on surveys and/or IEP attendance to their targeted area(s). If you need to brush up on family engagement data, go to the GaDOE Elluminate archives. # ANECDOTAL DATA STORIES to be REVIEWED by GaDOE STAFF!

You asked for it, you got it! **NEW this year**....each anecdotal data story will be reviewed with an evaluation rubric currently being developed by the Divisions' Professional Learning Unit. The rubric will be based on the PTA National Parent Involvement Standards and the state's three family engagement strategies. This will provide mentors and directors the ongoing feedback they requested to receive before planning initiatives for the new school year.

At the September, PMP regional meetings, mentors will receive their rubric. Additionally, each mentor will be asked to bring their district's FY'10 parent survey results (*if the system was the FY'10 survey sampling cycle*) as well as the system's IEP attendance results for the schools that the mentor targeted in his/her plan.

Together, we are working to build evidence-based best practices

to increase student achievement and outcomes for students, particularly for those with disabilities, through our family engagement work.
